Class periods: Most of the classes are scheduled for one period (50 minutes). There are some classes, position specific, CPR/First Aid, etc..., that are scheduled for multiple periods. Be sure to consult the schedule so you do not overlap your classes.

Youth Classes: There are several Youth Leadership classes being offered at U of S. There are also other classes for which youth age 14+ are welcome to join adults. These classes are designated with 14+.

Lunch: An all-you-can-eat lunch is included in your registration fee. You will be given a lunch ticket with your registration. Please do not lose this ticket. When going to the campus cafeteria, present your ticket at the door.

Scout Shop: A shop will be open throughout the day. Need a Leader Guide? Forgot to buy your favorite camp shirt this summer? Need patches? Just feel like browsing? Come on by and see what's available.

Coffee and Dippin' Donuts will be available for purchase throughout the day from the Utica College History Club. And remember, if you haven't had a Dippin' Donut, you haven't lived!

Parking and Carpooling: We encourage your unit to carpool. Look for signs to know where UofS parking is permitted.

Youth Programs, aka Day Care: (Age 5-11) The brothers of Alpha Phi Omega, a service fraternity founded on the principles of Boy Scouting, will be running activities such as crafts, hikes, skits, movies, etc., throughout the day to keep your children busy while you attend classes. Drop off begins at 8:45 and continues throughout the day.

Outdoor Classes: Some classes will be outside, such as Dutch oven cooking classes. We encourage you to bring layers to help stay warm and comfortable inside and out.

Individual Schedules: A detailed schedule, including class numbers and a campus map, will be given to each participant at check-in Saturday morning.

From points east and west

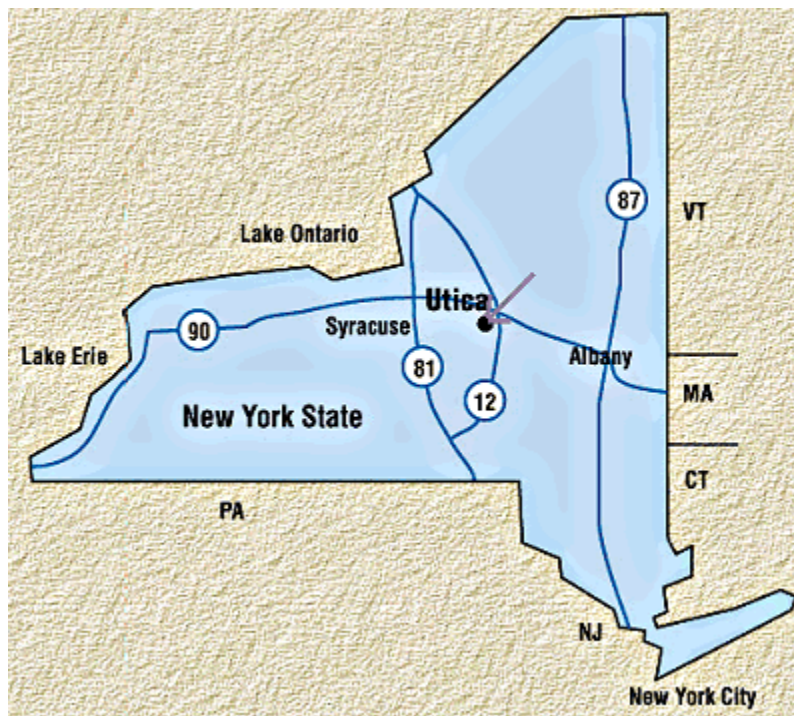
Travel the New York State Thruway I-90 to Exit 31 (Utica). Follow the signs carefully to Route 12 South and take the Burrstone Road/Utica College exit. The exit ramp ends at a stop light; take a left onto Burrstone Road West and look for the sign marking the entrance to Utica College (on the right).

From the south

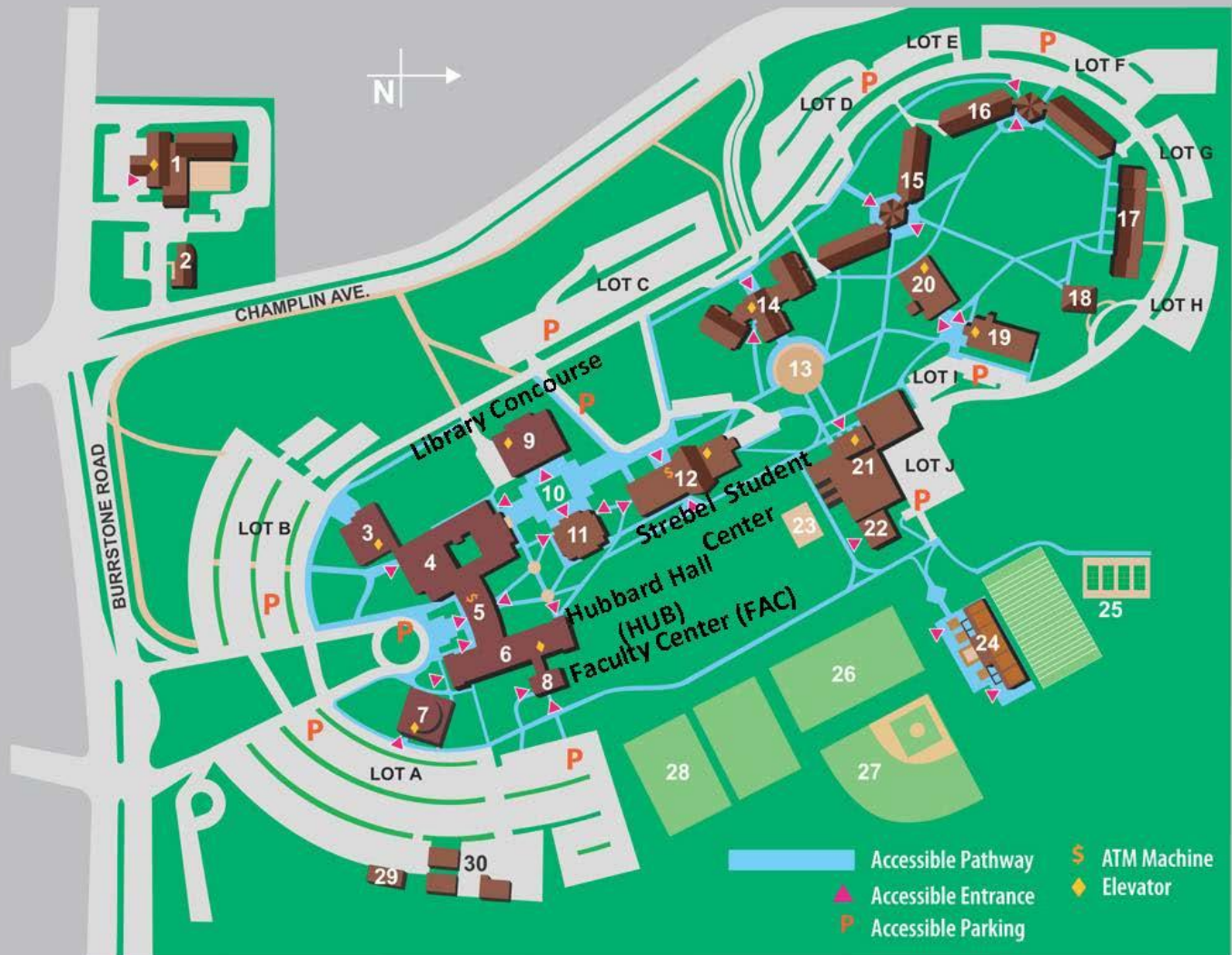
