The idea for “Scouts Trash the Trash Day” came from the Scouts of Troop 1206 in Helena, Montana after realizing that there are several days throughout the year that Scouts get together and do the same thing on the same day. Scouts are asked to bring a non-scout with them on this day of service in order to double the impact of their trash cleaning effort.

“Scout Trash the Trash Day” is about more than just cleaning our planet, it is a day to show the world what Scouting is about, educate individuals about Scouting and recruit new boys, girls and adults into the Scouting movement.
