We are proud to offer an exclusive fun patch for Boy Scouts. The patch can be earned by completing this Discovery Tour and mailing this sheet to the Leatherstocking Council BSA. Use the Museum map on the back of this page and find your way through the exhibits.

1. **A SCOUT IS TRUSTWORTHY:** Boy Scouts are seen as trustworthy in what they say and what they do. During World War II, catcher Moe Berg was trusted as a spy for the OSS (today's CIA). In the *Taking the Field* exhibit on the second floor, find Berg's silver badge from the Tour of the Far East. What year was this tour?

2. **A SCOUT IS HELPFUL:** Boy Scouts do their best to help others. Babe Ruth helped children by visiting them in hospitals. In *Babe Ruth: His Life and Legend*, find the section titled "Homer for Johnny Sylvester." It tells the story of Ruth helping a boy by promising to hit a home run for him. How many home runs did Babe hit for Johnny?

3. **A SCOUT IS KIND:** Boy Scouts treat others the way they want to be treated. Hall of Famer Hank Aaron was known for his kindness, and won many awards on and off the field for his good deeds. In *Souls of the Game* find the Presidential Medal of Freedom awarded to Aaron. What year did he receive this award?

4. **A SCOUT IS COURTEOUS:** Boy Scouts are polite and always use good manners. The women of the All-American Girls Professional Baseball League were expected to be courteous on and off the field. One of the players donated her suitcase to the Museum, where it is on exhibit in *Diamond Dreams*. What is her name?

5. **A SCOUT IS THRIFTY:** Boy Scouts save money and never waste resources. Roberto Clemente grew up in poverty in Puerto Rico and learned the value of saving money. In the *iViva Baseball!* Exhibit, find the jersey that says "Cangrejeros." Below the jersey is a copy of Clemente's first professional contract with this team in Santurce, Puerto Rico. What was Clemente's weekly salary?

6. **A SCOUT IS BRAVE:** Boy Scouts face difficult situations and always do what they think is right. Curt Flood was brave when he took a stand and refused to report to a team that he did not want to be traded to. In the exhibit, *Whole New Ballgame*, find the 1970 baseball card that shows the team that tried to acquire Flood in a trade with the St. Louis Cardinals. What was the name of this team?

7. **A SCOUT IS FRIENDLY:** Boy Scouts are friendly to everyone! Baseball mascots are also known as being friendly, especially with fans. As you enter the exhibit, *Sacred Ground*, a fuzzy green mascot is ready to greet you. What is the name of this popular mascot?

8. **A SCOUT IS LOYAL:** Boy Scouts are loyal to their friends, their families and their communities. Many Hall of Famers are loyal to their teammates, especially Cal Ripken Jr., who played 2632 consecutive games in his career! In *One for the Books*, find Ripken's helmet from the game where he broke the record for consecutive games played. Next to the helmet is a uniform that belonged to the player that held the record before Ripken. Who was that player?

9. **A SCOUT IS CHEERFUL:** Boy Scouts always look on the bright side. Inducted in 1977, Hall of Famer Ernie Banks was known for his cheerful demeanor and positive attitude, which led to one of his famous nicknames: Mr. Sunshine. Find plaque in the Hall of Fame *Plaque Gallery*. What is his other famous nickname?

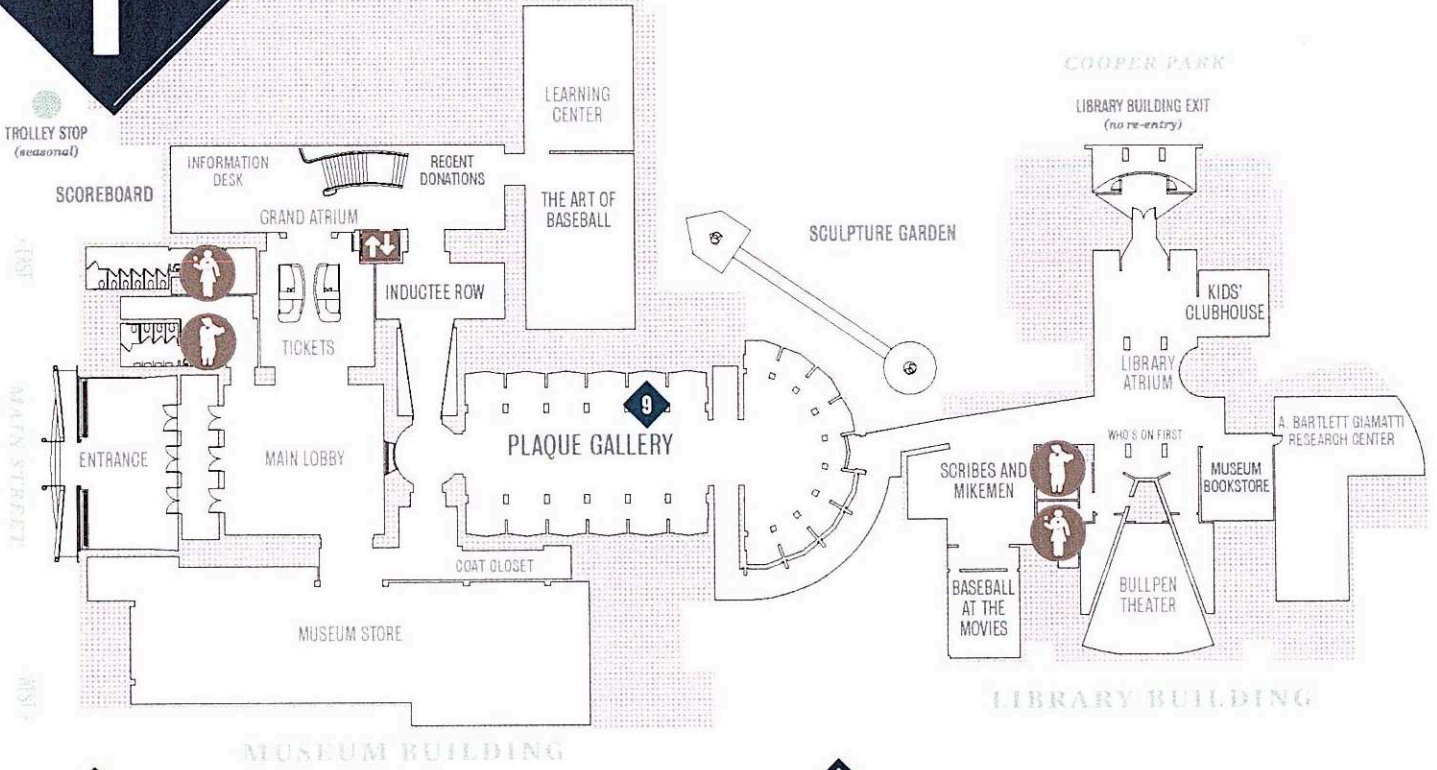

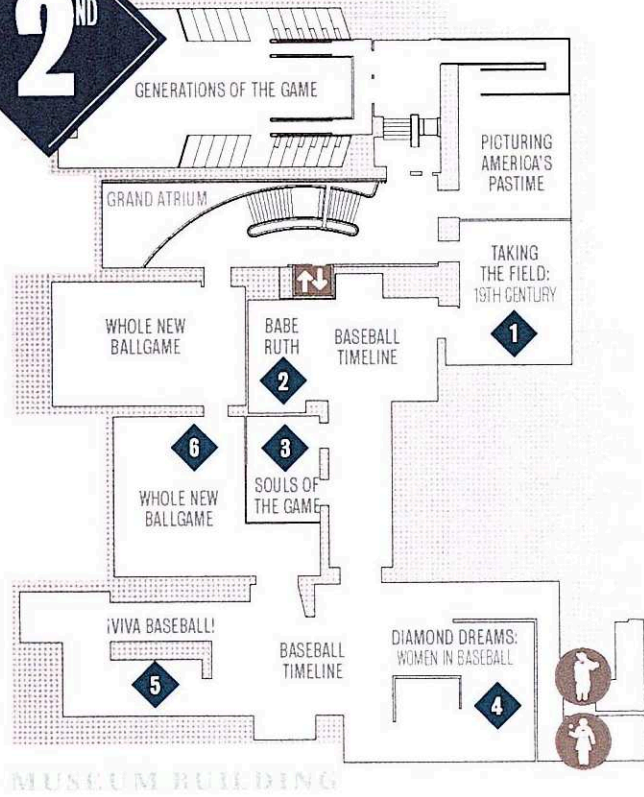
